RE: Concerns Regarding Off Road ATCM (Regulation)

To Whom It May Concern:

Robert R. Peacher, Inc. is a General Engineering Contractor 1 out of the 90,000 contractors in California. We specialize in Heavy Construction, such as street and road and grading of land. We have over 20 pieces of equipment that we use in our business on regular basis out of the 187,000 (estimated) that are used in California.

Peterson Tractor Company invited us to a meeting in August of 2006, concerning the Regulations that the ARB is wanting to implement. We were astonished at what we were being told by the Peterson Tractor Representative. At that time when we reviewed our equipment with the proposed regulation we had 11 Tier 0 and 9 Tier 1.

After the revisions made to the proposed regulation as of April, 2007, we have 18 pieces that are a tier 0 and 2 that are tier 1. With this latest and greatest news we started looking at our options. We looked at what it would cost to re-power just our scrapers. We were looking at 50K+ per tractor. That is at least 150K+ dollars that we would be in debt just on our scrapers. Then we looked at the cost to replace them. We were looking at 350K per tractor. That is at least \$1,050,000.00 that we would be in debt just on our scrapers if we replaced them. Then we looked at if we retired and sold the equipment. Well that was interesting, because if the ARB passes the new regulation our investment in our equipment will be devalued at an estimated two-thirds, than from the sale of the equipment, we have to give 45% of the sale to taxes, employees out of a job, no more business for Peterson Tractor, Drane Truck and Tractor Repair, Vanella Oil, Comercial Tire, Big Four Tire, Pollack Steel, Thomas Welding, Thomas Hydraulic, MJB Welding, T.B. S. Mobile Service, Omega Tank & Truck, Diesel Electric, DMV and ect. Butte County Tax Basis Gone.

We have worked hard over the years to build a good fleet of equipment, a good fleet of equipment that we own. Now (with the new proposed regulation) it is all being taken way. The ARB wants to put us in debt or take us out of business. That is not right.

The ARB has not taken into consideration the debt that they are putting the contractor in or the employees that will loose there job or the business that will be taken away from vendors. We feel that the ARB needs to review what they are doing. The ARB needs to look at the whole picture. The ARB needs to develop a plan that benefits both the ARB and the Contractor. Putting a contractor in debt or forcing them out of business is not right.

Why is the board made up of a majority of ARB employees? Why do you not have any contractors and large equipment manufactures on the board?

We all want CLEAN AIR. We all need to work together to make it happen. It cannot happen at the expense of the Contractor.

Every road that you travel on, every parking lot, building, park and home that you travel across, walk into and lay your head at night, they all sit on a foundation that was built by that estimated 186,000 pieces of equipment and the 90,000 contractors that are in California.






