The staff of the California Air Resources Board (ARB) invites you to participate in a public consultation meeting to discuss manure management activities as they relate to Assembly Bill 32, the California Global Warming Solutions Act of 2006 (AB 32; Statutes of 2006, chapter 488). The meeting will be divided into three parts. The first part will provide background information on AB 32. The second part will cover staff's investigation of potential manure management measures. Wrapping up the day, staff will discuss the development of ARB's manure management protocols. The public consultation meeting will be held at the time and location shown below:

AB 32 Background

AB 32 creates a comprehensive, multi-year program to reduce greenhouse gas (GHG) emissions in California, with the overall goal of restoring emissions to 1990 levels by the year 2020. The Act recognizes that such an ambitious effort requires careful planning and a well thought out set of strategies. Accordingly, ARB has identified specific actions to be developed into regulatory or non-regulatory GHG measures. These include

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discrete early regulatory actions, additional GHG reduction strategies anticipated to include regulations and other non-regulatory measures, and conventional air pollution control measures that are expected to yield GHG emission reduction co-benefits. Voluntary and educational efforts are examples of non-regulatory measures that can deliver GHG emission reductions. Staff plans to explore all of these options as a means to achieve the goals of AB 32.

Manure Management Measures

Manure Management is one of many GHG reduction measures that are part of the State's strategy for achieving GHG reductions under AB 32.

The second part of the meeting (10:00 am to 12:00 pm) will cover manure management measures. Staff will solicit stakeholder input on the development of potential GHG reduction measures for manure management activities. Manure Management Protocols

The development of manure management protocols is part of the State's strategy for achieving voluntary GHG reductions under AB 32. The Act requires that the ARB adopt methodologies that will be used for calculating voluntary GHG reductions. The California Climate Action Registry (CCAR) recently adopted a protocol that provides the methodologies for quantifying baseline manure emissions and the emission reductions resulting from the installation and operation of a manure digester.

The third part of the meeting (1:00 pm to 4:00 pm) will cover manure management protocols. Staff will solicit stakeholder input on the CCAR protocol. Staff plans to conduct a series of public consultation meetings on the CCAR manure digester protocol with the goal of presenting it to the Board for approval in 2008. 
