

Fact Sheet about the CCOS Emission Inventory Preparation Plan

What is the Emission Inventory Preparation Plan?

The Emission Inventory Preparation Plan is designed to list all the steps needed to develop emission inventories to support air quality modeling for CCOS. Along with each step is the agency that will be accomplishing the task and the projected timeframe for completing the task.

What is the purpose of the Preparation Plan?

The Preparation Plan is a way to display all of the tasks so that each agency involved can plan resources and monitor progress. This plan will be a master list that everyone can use to keep such a large project involving many agencies continuing in a timely manner. The Preparation Plan is a “living” document that will be updated as needed. This plan is considered draft and still open for modification. All agencies involved are encouraged to provide input to the Preparation Plan.

How is the Preparation Plan organized?

The plan is broken down into several sections. Key projects include:

- Conduct QA/QC Activities
- Day-specific Data Collection
- 2000 Baseline Modeling Inventory Development
- Integration of Day-specific Information
