Re: Request for Proposals: Development and Evaluation of Corroborative Analysis Methods

On behalf of the San Joaquin Valleywide Air Pollution Study Agency (Study Agency), the Air Resources Board (ARB) invites you to submit proposals in response to the "Request for Proposals (RFP) on the Reinvestigation of the September 2000 Ozone Episode in Central California". The RFP, as well as responses to questions raised regarding the RFP and any clarifications or modifications, will be posted on the Study web site located at: <http://www.arb.ca.gov/airways/ccos/RFPs/default.htm>. A hardcopy of the RFP can also be mailed upon request.

As required by the Study Agency, all proposals must certify that the organizations offering to perform the contracted services have not been disqualified as participants in federally funded projects. Eligibility for award may also require certification that recipients comply with all regulations relating to the award of federal funds. Special consideration of eligibility in the selection process may be requested in accordance with federal guidelines.

If you desire to respond to the RFP, proposals must be submitted in accordance with the guidelines discussed in the RFP. The proposal must be signed by an official authorized to bind the offeror, and it must contain a statement to the effect that the proposal is firm for a period of not less than 90 days after the final submittal date. An original and 2 copies of the proposal, and an electronic PDF file of the proposal, should be submitted to:
