Notice of Public Meeting to Consider Assembly Bill 617 Community Air Protection Program – Community Emissions Reduction Program for Stockton

The California Air Resources Board (CARB or Board) will conduct a public meeting at the date and time noted below to consider the approval of the Community Emissions Reduction Program for the Stockton Community

If the meeting is to be held in person, it will be held at the California Air Resources Board, Byron Sher Auditorium, 1001 I Street, Sacramento, California 95814.

This item will be considered at a meeting of the Board, which will commence at 4:00 p.m., July 29, 2021.

Background

Assembly Bill (AB) 617 (C. Garcia, Chapter 136, 2017), signed into law in July 2017, requires new community-focused action to reduce air pollution and improve public health in communities that experience disproportionate burdens from exposure to air pollutants. To implement this statute, CARB established the Community Air Protection Program (Program). At its September 27, 2018, hearing, the Board approved the “Community Air Protection Blueprint” (Blueprint), which contains detailed requirements for community emissions reduction programs, community air monitoring plans, and other elements of the Program. ([Resolution 18-33](#)). At the same meeting, the Board also selected the first ten communities to implement community emissions reduction programs, community air monitoring, or both. Since then, the Board has selected five additional communities for these targeted local actions.

Once CARB selects a community to develop a community emissions reduction program, the local air district must work with the community to develop and adopt a community emissions reduction program. Subsequently, the air district must submit the community emissions reduction program to CARB for consideration.

CARB selected the community of Stockton for a community emissions reduction program on December 13, 2019. The San Joaquin Valley Air Pollution Control

District (SJVAPCD) worked with a community steering committee to develop the Stockton Community Emissions Reduction Program (CERP) to reduce exposure to air pollution in the community. The SJVAPCD Governing Board adopted the CERP on March 18, 2021.

CARB staff reviewed the CERP to determine whether it: complies with the minimum criteria the legislation and the Blueprint established for community emissions reduction programs; reflects community priorities; and sets a foundation to deliver emissions and exposure reductions in Stockton. CARB staff also held a community meeting on June 21, 2021, to hear directly from Stockton community members and other stakeholders on their perspectives on the CERP. CARB staff released the *Stockton Community Emissions Reduction Program Staff Report*, which contains a summary of the review and staff recommendations to the Board.

Proposed Action
