We are pleased to inform the South Coast Air Quality Management District (District) that the Air Resources Board (ARB) is now able to release project funds from the October 2009 sale of Build America Bonds to support the Proposition 1B: Goods Movement Emission Reduction Program projects listed below:

These additional monies will allow the District to fund all eligible applicants from the Summer 2009 solicitation for port trucks, including applicants on the existing, competitively ranked list (both Tier 1 and Tier 2 applications), as well as the backup applications not yet evaluated. These monies will also allow the District to fund projects under the other trucks and locomotives grants.

Although the project funding listed above is coming from the sale of the Build America Bonds that limit expenditures to capital costs only, ARB is using some of the administrative funding we received in late 2009 for our own operations to provide each local agency with the initial administrative funding for each grant agreement as listed below. ARB's ability to pay the final administrative funding is dependent on the sale of appropriate, additional bonds. We are actively seeking these funds for local agencies.


