The second installment of \$71 million from Build America Bonds is being applied to restart the highest priority projects (all of these funds must be applied to projects, with no reimbursement for administration). These disbursements will accomplish three goals: replace any remaining pre-77 school buses as required by statute, provide funding for contracts executed prior to the 12/18/08 stop work notice by the Department of Finance, and provide funding to those districts with the largest air quality need.
