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Barriers to LHD Involvement

<u>At State Level</u>	<u>At Local Level</u>
<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Lack of capacity/time/staff	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Lack of capacity/time/staff
<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Opportunities unclear, don't know the players	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• No clear mandate
<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Concern about limits of authority – don't want to be seen as lobbying	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Seen as too political
<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Believe impact greater at local or regional level	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Seen as too distant – need evidence of current local impacts
	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Lack of support from local leadership

Local health department work to improve climate change and health at local and regional level :

- Involvement in SCS/RTP under SB 375
- Climate Action Plans
- Environmental Impact Reports
- General Plans, Bike and Pedestrian Plans, Health element, etc.
- Active transportation, Safe Routes to Schools, etc.



Where Can Climate Change Fit in LHDs

Not limited to a single program area

- Public health preparedness (LA, Tulare, Merced)
- Built environment/healthy planning (Alameda County)
- Health equity (BARHII, San Diego)
- Environmental health (LA, Kings, Mendocino)
- Epidemiology/health policy (San Mateo, Contra Costa)
- Health promotion/chronic disease (SLO county)
- Nutrition, local food security, urban ag, farmers' markets
- Health education, community education/engagement
- Infectious disease/vector borne disease
- Public health nursing

Local Health Departments & State Climate Action

Actions taken:

- Input on guidelines (e.g., Safeguarding CA Implementation Plan, OPR General Plan Guideline Updates)
- Informational testimony at Senate Committees when asked
- Participation in meetings hosted by assembly members (e.g., Sea Level Rise Summit at NASA)



LHD Suggestions for the Climate Change & Health Team

- Support dedicated funding for LHDs to work on climate change
- Encourage CDPH to issue a mandate for LHDs to do climate work
- Encourage LHDs to support the local agencies in applying for GGRF funding (i.e., Affordable Housing & Sustainable Communities Grants)
- Alert LHDs about guidelines and plans needing comments
- Share CDPH Office of Legislative Affairs final list of bills



LHD Suggestions for the Climate Change & Health Team

- Provide technical assistance
- Provide communications materials that can be tailored to county
- Provide research, tools, and local data, e.g.:
 - Template for local vulnerability assessment
 - Quantify cost savings of climate action at local level
 - Attributable risk of local harms due to climate change
- Model strong leadership for public health involvement
