## Public Meeting to Discuss the Wilmington Air Monitoring Study

The Air Resources Board invites you to attend a community meeting to learn about the results of a study that measured air pollution in the Wilmington community. The study focused on measuring levels of air pollution in places where children live and play such as Wilmington Park Elementary School.

The meeting will be held:

At this meeting, ARB staff will present the results from the air monitoring study and answer questions. We encourage you to attend and find out about air quality in your community.

During 2001 and 2002, the Air Resources Board measured outdoor air pollution at the Mahar House which is across the street from Wilmington Park Elementary School and at the Hawaiian Street Elementary School. This monitoring study was conducted as part of the requirements of the Children's Environmental Health Protection Act (Escutia, 1999). The objective of this study was to determine the impact of large industrial facilities, the Port of Los Angeles, and other transportation-associated emissions on the air quality at these two schools. The results of this study were also used to compare air quality in Wilmington with other areas of Los Angeles.

There will also be a status report on the children's indoor air study conducted at Wilmington Park Elementary School in 2002.
