


Background

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Consumer Products Are...

- Chemically Formulated Products
- Used by Household and Institutional Consumers
- Includes Personal Care, Automotive Care, and Household Care Products



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California Clean Air Act Requirements:

- Adopt Maximum Feasible Reduction of VOCs From Consumer Products
- Regulations Must be Feasible, Both Commercially and Technologically
- Prohibits Elimination of a Product Form


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Existing Measures

- **Five Related Regulations** (Antiperspirants and Deodorants, Consumer Products, Aerosol Coatings, Alternative Control Plan, Hairspray Credit Program)
- **VOC Limits for 83 Categories**
- **Prohibit use of Perchloroethylene, Methylene Chloride, and Trichloroethylene in Specific Categories and Track Use in other Categories**


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Emission Trend

State Implementation Plan

- Federally Enforced Commitment
- 25-40 tpd Reduction in VOC From Consumer Products
- 3 Separate Rulemakings
 - 2004 5 tpd
 - 2006 10-20 tpd
 - 2008 10-15 tpd
- Product Surveys
- Further Reductions from Category

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Regulation Development

- Public Process with Stakeholder Involvement Throughout
- Survey to Collect Necessary Data
- Evaluate Current and Emerging Low VOC Technology
- Assess Economic Impacts
- Analyze Environmental Impacts
- Propose Standards



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2004 Amendment Goal

- Adopt New Consumer Product Category VOC Limits That Will Achieve a *Minimum* Statewide Emission Reduction of 5 Tons Per Day by December 31, 2006.

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Proposed Regulatory Concept Changes

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Most Restrictive Limit

- Regulation Applies Standard Based on Principal Display Panel
- Changes Would Address Labels that Indicate Product is Suitable for Other Uses
- Changes Would Apply Lowest VOC Limit for Claims Made Anywhere on Label
- Proposal would also Apply Between Regulations

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Product Dating (Code Dating)

- Regulation Currently Requires That the Date of Manufacture be Displayed on a Regulated Product
- The Date May be Coded if Instructions on How to Interpret Code are Filed with ARB Staff
- Many Companies Have Not Filed Required Date Code Information or Have Changed Date Code without Notification

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Product Dating (Code Dating) (Continued)

- Proposed Changes Would Require That Date of Manufacture be Placed On Product
- Date Coding Would No Longer Be Permitted

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Diluted Products

- Applicable to Automotive Windshield Washer Fluids Only
- Washer Fluid is Subject to Different VOC Limits in Different Parts of The State
- Current Regulation Does Not Allow Multiple Dilution Instructions
- Proposed Changes Would Allow One Product With Multiple Dilution Instructions for All Areas of State

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Notification of End of Sell Through Period

- Products Allowed to be Sold up to 3 Years After Effective Date of VOC Limit if Manufactured Before Date of Applicable Limit
- Changes Address Issue of Out of Compliance Products on Shelves After Sell Through Period Expires
- Enables Retailers to Remove Non-Complying Products From Store Shelves at the Appropriate Time

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Proposal to Address Deodorants and Personal Fragrances

- Clarify Deodorant and Personal Fragrance Product Definitions
- Apply the Most Restrictive Limit Clause Between Regulations
- Ensures Emission Reductions Claimed Continue to be Achieved
- Allow Time for Products to Re-label, if Necessary

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Clarify/Modify Aerosol Product Definition

- Current Definition Refers to a Product Form
- Proposed Change is Minor in Nature - Clarification Only
- Change Would Clarify That Alternative Packaging Products are Included

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Change Gel to Semisolid

- Current Definition of Gel Refers to a Distinct Product Form
- Gel Definition is Not Clear
 - Subject to interpretation
 - Does not reflect many products in market
- Semisolid is More Descriptive of Products in Market

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Modification of LVP-VOC Definition

- LVP-VOCs are Lower Vapor Pressure Compounds Which can be Used to Meet VOC Weight % Limits
- Changes to Definition are Minor
- More than 12 Carbon Atom Cut Point Provision Remains
 - Invoked if Boiling Point is Unknown
 - Must be Verified by Formulation Data

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Clarification of Reporting Requirements

- Make Clear That any Party Holding Necessary Information Must Report to ARB if Requested
- No New Requirements
- Clarify Existing Requirements That are Already Part of State Law
- Changes Attempt to Address Difficulties Encountered Obtaining Information During Recent Survey

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Changes to Method 310

- Test method for Determining Products Compliance with VOC Limits
- Changes to Method are Minor
- Changes include Update to Test Method Citations, Dates, etc.

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Other Minor Changes to Regulation

- Clarify labeling requirements for Aerosol Adhesives
- Move limit for Wasp and Hornet Insecticides to appear with other Insecticides in the Table of Standards

 - Reductions: **0.538 tpd**

- Chemically Cured Adhesive Remover
 - Emissions: 0.031 tpd
 - Proposed Limit: 50 %
 - Emissions Increase: **0.01 tpd**
- General Adhesive Remover
 - Emissions: 0.796 tpd
 - Proposed Limit: 20%
 - Reductions: **0.626 tpd**

- Aerosols
 - Emissions: 0.275 tpd
 - Proposed Limit: 20%
 - Reductions: **0.220 tpd**

 - Emissions: 0.067 tpd

 - Emissions: 0.090 tpd
 - Proposed Limit: 80 %
 - Reductions: **0.000 tpd**

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Electronic Cleaner
