**SPRAY SHINE
(Aerosol and Non-aerosol)**

**Preliminary Draft VOC Limit: (aerosol): 55% by weight
(non-aerosol): 20% by weight**

I. Product Definition:

“Spray Shine” means any aerosol or non-aerosol consumer product designed primarily for the purpose of dispensing droplets on and into a hair coiffure for the primary purpose of creating a shine. This category includes dual use products such as those whose primary purpose is to impart a sheen to the hair and whose secondary purpose is to condition the hair, but it does not include products whose primary purpose is to condition or hold the hair. This category also does not include hairspray, hair mousse, hair styling gel or spray gel.

II. Typical Formulations of Complying Products (Category 770):

Disclaimer: The following sample formulations for complying products are not intended to be complete formulations. Air Resources Board staff realize that consumer product formulations are often complex mixtures that require extensive testing to optimize. The sample formulations are intended to illustrate the approximate proportions of compounds that may be used to formulate a consumer product that meets the draft volatile organic compound limits for the Mid-term Measures.

A. Aerosol Products:

1. Non-VOC propellant based formulation:

Wt. %	Ingredient
55	VOC solvent
40	Non-VOC liquefied gas propellant
3-7	LVP oil

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B. Non-aerosols:

1. Non-VOC solvent based formulation:*

Wt. %	Ingredient
80-100	VMS & LVP
0-20	VOC solvent
