

## **ATTENTION CALIFORNIA OFF-HIGHWAY RECREATIONAL VEHICLE (OHRV) OWNERS**

Off Highway-Recreational Vehicle (OHRV) registration guidelines have changed. The type of registration sticker issued this year to your OHRV may be different than previously issued. Please read the following important information regarding the use of your OHRV on public lands in California. ### **CALIFORNIA'S OHRV PROGRAM**

California has an OHRV program that includes the way your OHRVs are built for use in California, how they are registered by the Department of Motor Vehicles (DMV) and how they are ridden on public lands.

### **GREEN STICKER**

Year round use at all California OHRV riding areas.

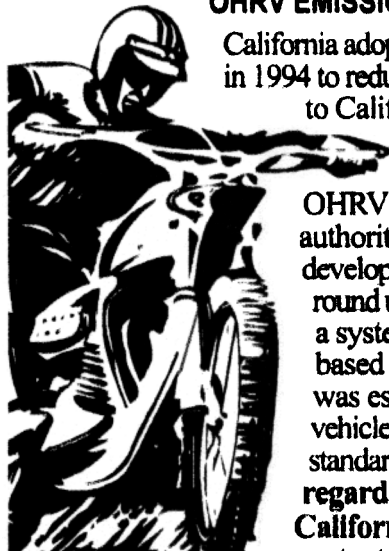
Green stickers are issued to OHRVs certified by their manufacturer to meet the California OHRV emission standards (anti-pollution) and ALL 2002 model year and older OHRVs. OHRVs certified to meet emissions standards are identified by a label attached to the vehicle frame by the manufacturer

### **RED STICKER**

At California OHRV riding areas, seasonal use only. A list of the seasonal riding periods is available by calling the Air Resources Board at (800) 242-4450 or on the web at [http://ohv.parks.ca.gov/default.asp?page\\_id=21928](http://ohv.parks.ca.gov/default.asp?page_id=21928).

Red Stickers are issued to 2003 model year and newer OHRVs that are not certified to California OHRV emission standards. Your OHRV should be issued a Red Sticker if it is a 2003 model year or newer vehicle and you see a "C" or "3" in the eighth digit of your VIN.

### **OHRV EMISSION STANDARDS**



ED- 004 (New 03/03)

California adopted OHRV emission standards in 1994 to reduce the contribution of OHRVs to California's air pollution problem.

The Air Resources Board, in conjunction with the OHRV industry, land management authorities and rider organizations developed emission standards for year-round use of new OHRVs. In addition, a system of seasonal riding areas, based on local air quality patterns, was established to allow use of new vehicles that do not meet the minimum standard.
