Key Points: Dean Simeroth broached the idea of near-, mid-, and long-term development of

changes to fuel regulations, with the near-term being changes feasible to

bring to the Board in August.

Staff proposed smaller increases to caps than WSPA had requested. WSPA

stated that it could not evaluate the proposal until the accompanying

evaporative and exhaust models are specified.

GM stated that the current typical "driveability index" of California gasolines is

acceptable, but some of the high-end values (>1170) are disturbing.

Participants discussed potential approaches to modeling evaporative benzene

emissions and incorporating reactivity into evaporative HC modeling.

ARB will draft language for proposed new enforcement tools to detect and

prevent illegal downstream blending.
