Dear Sir or Madam:

The California Air Resources Board (ARB/Board) staff invites you to attend the fifth and final meeting of the Low Carbon Fuel Standard (LCFS) Advisory Panel (Panel). On April 23, 2009, the Board approved the LCFS regulation. The regulation became effective as of April 15, 2010. Section 95489 of the regulation requires the Executive Officer to conduct two reviews of the LCFS program in a public process. The Executive Officer is required to convene a Panel with which he will consult on the reviews. The reviews will address a broad range of implementation topics and may include recommended amendments to the regulation. Staff will present the results of these reviews to the Board by January 1, 2012, and January 1, 2015.

During this meeting, we will discuss the draft final version of the regulation review report to the Board. The report includes all of the chapters and topics previously discussed by the Panel in previous meetings. This will be the culminating meeting of the Panel prior to the report to the Board in December. There will also be time allotted for public comments and open discussion.
