

Seth Meyer, University of Missouri

Seth Meyer, an Iowa native, has a MS in Economics from Iowa State University and a PhD in Agricultural Economics from The University of Missouri. He is currently a Research Assistant Professor with the Department of Agricultural and Applied Economics at the University of Missouri and an analyst with the Food and Agricultural Policy Research Institute (FAPRI).

As an analyst at FAPRI Dr. Meyer works on domestic crops and biofuel policy modeling as well as agricultural commodity transportation and crop yield analysis. The policy modeling effort is primarily in support of congressional requests for independent analysis of the effects of proposed legislation in agriculture and energy markets from ACRE payments to biofuel mandates. Funding from the Environmental Protection Agency has helped to expand the representation of biomass markets, including crop residues and dedicated biomass crops (corn stover and switchgrass). The Department of Energy has funded the creation of an international model to examine land-use changes and consumer effects of biofuel and other agricultural policies in primary commodity producing and consuming countries with an emphasis on low income countries. FAPRI at Missouri has a long history of objective analysis and this reputation contributes the wide range of funding sources that FAPRI and Dr. Meyer have received to support their work.
