Comment:

My name is Judith Borcz. I represent the volunteer organization, Climate Action CA in the Bay Area, and lead the transportation sub-committee. I want to advocate strongly for the <strong>alternative</strong> plan to bring more electric trucks to the road faster, and strengthen it to better address the largest polluting trucks, big rigs/drayage. Specifically, I ask that the rule require <strong>100% zero-emission vehicle sales by 2036 rather than 2040</strong>.&nbsp; The technology is there to achieve this goal, and our very poor air quality and climate change impacts are already severe. Drought and increased wildfires in the state are causing huge costs to us all, and the health impacts of air quality are prevalent.&nbsp;

Our group asks that <strong>class 7 and 8 truck regulations
should cover fleet sizes of 10 or greater, rather than 50, and as
Senator Durazo stated, the regulations should fall to the large
corporations that operate the trucks rather than burdening
mis-classified "independent" truckers</strong>.&nbsp; We advocate
that class 8 sleeper cabs be moved from group 3 to group 2 vehicles
in the high priority fleet rule so that all class 7 and 8 tractors
are subject to the same transition schedule beginning 2027 rather
than 2030.

CA has some of the most polluted air in the country as you have shown in your presentation today. Port and Central Valley warehouse communities are severly impacted. We must do more to get rid of diesel exhaust pollution. And we must do so much quicker than the current rule proposes.

Hello.<span style="mso-spacerun: yes;">&nbsp; </span>I am Tom Greene from Rancho California Water District.<span style="mso-spacerun: yes;"> </span>We serve over 150,000 people in Southwest Riverside County. < span style="mso-spacerun: yes;"> </span>We have over 1,000 miles of pipes, 100 wells and pump stations and one hundred trucks.<span style="mso-spacerun:</pre> yes; "> </span>We currently have 7 and a half Megawatts of solar power, and are working on another 5 Megawatts of hydro-electric and battery storage projects.<span style="mso-spacerun: yes;"> </span>We have 6 vehicle charge points installed so far and many of our employees are early adopters with good results.<span style="mso-spacerun: yes;">&nbsp; </span> Because of those good results, We have been looking to purchase heavy duty electric trucks and we are working on a vehicle electrification master plan. <span style="mso-spacerun: yes;"> </span>We&rsquo;ve checked the specifications from over 30 manufacturers, on over 50 trucks, many of which don' t even have a prototype yet. But we yet haven't yet found any chassis cabs or even heavy-duty pickups that can meet the gross vehicle weight ratings and trailer towing ratings, along with the distances needed to replace our trucks. Some bus chassis looked promising, but a few manufacturers have told us that the drive-trains are not rated for towing. Thus, we are settling on purchasing some all-electric half-ton pickups for inspectors in the short term. < span style="mso-spacerun: yes; "> </span>Specifications show that these trucks can tow heavy loads, but testing has shown that they lose range by up to two thirds when towing.<span style="mso-spacerun: yes;">&nbsp; </span>Thus, we are expecting that those trucks won&rsquo;t be able to carry the loads needed to do the work we need done every day.<span style="mso-spacerun: yes;">&nbsp; </span>We need to fix pipes in the roads, this is work we do every day. < span style="mso-spacerun: yes;"> </span>Our work is often performed in the streets, where the vehicles also use power take off equipment and where there aren't any charge points.<span style="mso-spacerun: yes;"> </span> We expect that the vehicle manufacturers will eventually engineer the trucks needed to perform our work in the future. and bap; But to have every single public agency, searching every single vehicle manufacturer to find specifications of all the vehicles, every single budgeting time of the fiscal year is wasteful and detrimental to getting the vehicles purchased. Thus, we join with the Association of California Water Agencies and the California Municipal Utilities Association in calling for CARB

to keep an ongoing Commercial Availability list, showing all of the specifications of vehicles, instead of a vehicle unavailability list. This includes the range results when fully loaded and the pricing. We need to know about trucks that are actually being built on assembly lines instead of just on the drawing boards.

We also join the Metropolitan Water District
in requesting that the rule have some flexibility to extend the 50%
buying limits till the year 2030 for those classes of vehicles that
are not commercially available. Thank you.
