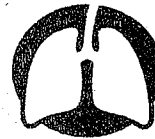

Dear Peter:

I really enjoyed meeting you in Indianapolis and was pleased that we were able to discuss our mutual goals for Green Transportation. I want to clarify that our GREEN TEAM is composed of the Silicon Valley Clean Cities Coalition (SVCCC), Breathe California (100 year old lung health and clean air organization) and the 7-year-old Electronic Transportation Development Center (ETDC). This team allows us to comprehensively address clean air goals, reducing dependency on foreign oil, and leveraging Silicon Valley green transportation technology.

Bob Garzee, our Clean Cities most senior board member, has worked with Breathe California for over 7 years. He is the founder and manager of the ETDC with a very strong strategic and operating knowledge of fleet alternative fuel vehicles (AFVs). Bob was recently appointed by our board as Green Transportation Specialist for Breathe California. The Green Team has made Bob our overall Team Leader and he has our full faith and trust to lead the three organizations' projects and to act on our behalf.

Bob has organized the Team, many other organizations and green transportation talent to cover AFV financing, workforce development training, and vehicle (CNG, Propane, Electric) and infrastructure (charging, fuel plant and solar fueling) demonstration and commercial projects. He is covering all of Silicon Valley and working with one heavy duty project city on school buses, and with 5 cities on light duty vehicles.

Since our support of California and AFVs is quite complex compared to others, I wanted to be sure that you were clear on Bob's responsibilities and our trust in his leadership. He is supported by myself and Patricia Tind, Clean Cities Co- Coordinators and our over 800 volunteers. He was Breathe California's Transportation Clean Air Award Winner for 2011 (joint Bay Area and Golden Gate). Attached is our recent newsletter highlighting our current Green Transportation projects.

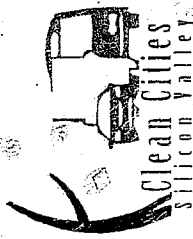

Silicon Valley Clean Cities Coalition: DOE Designation in 1994

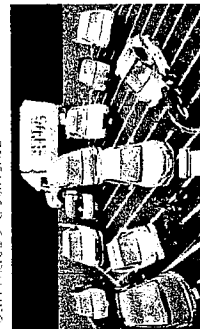
Mission and Vision:

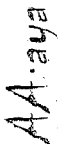

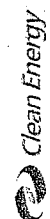

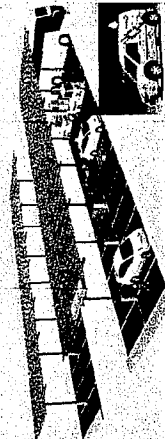
