We are writing to express our support of the Volkswagen's Zero Emission Vehicle (ZEV) Investment Plan, including the designation of Sacramento as the first Green City with a proposed investment of \$44 million by June 2018. We believe that the City of Sacramento is a strong, capable partner that is ready to deliver on this important opportunity. The Sacramento Running Association has a history of working with the City/in the community to deliver ambitious projects and programs that benefit the region. We organize the California International Marathon, which is one of Sacramento's oldest and largest sporting events. We are aiming to become Sacramento's first outdoor sporting event that is certified as sustainable by The Council for Responsible Sport.

The Sacramento Running Association is ready to support with delivering transformational outcomes for the Sacramento region. We believe that Volkswagen's investment in Sacramento can provide a broad benefit that spurs innovation across the region. We support proposed investments in EV car sharing programs, ZEV delivery and taxi fleets, community charging infrastructure, and public education activities. These investments are important to our efforts in producing sustainable sporting events that enhance the health of our community.

Sacramento is one of the most diverse communities in the nation, with significant potential to bring new ideas and service models to scale.
