Re: BMW Comments on the Proposed Funding Plan for the Fiscal Year 2014-2015 for the Air Quality Improvement Program (AQIP)

Members of the Board,

BMW Group appreciates the opportunity to comment on the 2014-2015 Funding Plan proposed for the Clean Vehicle Rebate Project (CVRP).

BMW supports the comments submitted by the Alliance of Automobile Manufacturers; this letter aims to highlight BMW position more specifically.

Monetary and non-monetary incentives are key enabling elements in support of the state's ambitious ZEV mandate and realization of Governors' Executive Order for placing 1.5 million Zero Emission Vehicles in California by 2025.

BMW supports staff's position that a continuation of monetary and non-monetary incentives is needed until a ZEV market share of at least 5% new vehicles is attained. The Advanced Technology Vehicles may still be seen as niche products at this stage; reaching a wider consumer acceptance and higher market penetration is essential for sustaining the products manufacturers have in the market and intend to introduce in the near term.

To that end BMW applauds staff's proposal which aims to continue the program and prevent consumer uncertainty. Further, the appropriation of funding for a variety of vehicle categories plus mobility solutions such as car sharing programs ensures an adequate consumer outreach and a better utilization of available resources.
