California has the worst air quality in the nation, in part because of diesel engine pollution from freight movement. People who live near a port, a freeway, a freight rail yard or a warehouse district get hit daily by toxic diesel pollution from trucks. As a result, they are more likely to suffer from lung and heart disease and shortened lifespan. Our analysis has conservatively estimated that current technology would allow for at least 15% of the trucks on the road be zero emission by 2030.
