## **RE: DRAFT Cap-and-Trade Auction Proceeds Investment Plan**

Dear Chair Nichols,

On behalf of the dozens of non-profit urban forestry organizations working statewide to green California, we are writing to offer our appreciation to the Board for a thoughtful and inclusive public process that helped inform the DRAFT Cap-and-Trade Auction Proceeds Investment Plan released by CARB on April 6<sup>th</sup>, 2013.

We are pleased to see the inclusion of urban forestry as an integral part of the CARB's recommendations for strategic investments of auction proceeds. These types of projects are critical components in increasing the livability of our communities while also providing significant GHG reductions through direct carbon sequestration.

We are also encouraged by the Plan's recognition of the role urban forestry can play in benefitting disadvantaged communities. The California ReLeaf Network of urban forestry non-profits works throughout the state to empower grassroots efforts and build strategic partnerships that preserve, protect, and enhance California's urban and community forests. As a network of non-profit entities, we have an outstanding record of working in concert with cities, counties, and special districts on projects that benefit California's communities and environment. Consequently, we are often best-suited to partner with disadvantaged communities to achieve local projects that are an integral element of the Draft Plan and will provide the greatest benefit.

Investments in trees, both in urban and rural communities, will help to reduce greenhouse gas emissions by reducing energy demand and urban heat island effect, and will compliment multiple other investment sectors identified, including affordable housing and public transit. These projects can also provide key health, safety, environmental, and economic co-benefits.

We believe urban forestry investments through CAL FIRE's Urban and Community Forestry Program will meet the goals and objectives of AB 32, AB 1532, SB 535 and SB 375, and we thank the Board for including urban forestry and natural resources in this strategy.
