Good morning CARB members,

We are writing to add our support for the fiscal year 2019-20 Funding Plan for Clean Transportation Incentives for Low Carbon Transportation Investments and the Air Quality Improvement Program.

We believe this funding is necessary to help gain public support of zero-emission and plug-in hybrid passenger vehicles through the Clean Vehicle Rebate Program (CVRP). This program gives additional incentives to the public for purchase of Electric Passenger Vehicles.

We benefited from the CVRP program when we leased a 2016 Chevrolet Spark EV, but unfortunately, we have been denied this rebate for the purchase of our 2019 Chevrolet Bolt EV. We unknowingly purchased our Chevrolet Bolt EV from a Chevrolet dealer in Oregon, not knowing that there are four requirements to be approved for the CVRP rebate in California.

- 1. Owner's income.
- 2. Owner must be a California resident.
- 3. Vehicle must be registered in California.
- 4. Vehicle must be purchased from a California dealer.

We would ask that the board approve a Rural Exemption for California citizen living in rural counties along the borders of Arizona, Nevada and Oregon as the closest option might be to purchase a CVRP vehicle in one of those states. Our Chevrolet dealer here in Crescent City is NOT approved by General Motors to sell the Chevrolet Bolt EV, leaving us to travel 150 miles out of state to purchase our vehicle.

We also would ask that you approve an exemption for us from the California dealer requirement to receive the CVRP rebate as we have met the first three requirements for the rebate and in fact towed the new Chevrolet Bolt EV back to California to register it at our local Crescent City DMV office paying California new vehicle sales tax, license & registration fees to the state through the Crescent City DMV office.

Dear Mr. Kaessinger and Ms. Hart,

Thank you for your letter regarding the Clean Vehicle Rebate Project (CVRP). The California Air Resources Board (CARB) has reviewed your letter in which you appeal the denial of your rebate application, A-406443. As specified in the CVRP Terms and Conditions, and the CVRP Implementation Manual (IM), "...if the only basis for an appeal is that the applicant disagrees with the policies set forth in the CVRP Terms and Conditions and the Implementation Manual, there is no basis for an appeal."

Your application was cancelled because your vehicle is considered to be an out of State purchase. Although your Bolt was registered in California, your Bolt was purchased in Oregon, as indicated on your State of Oregon purchase contract. According to the CVRP IM, "eligible vehicles may not be purchased or leased out of State." Because this is a requirement and policy outlined in the CVRP IM, we regret to inform you that you have no basis for an appeal; therefore, you remain ineligible for the CVRP rebate.

Mr. Kaessinger,

Thank you for reaching out to our office looking for assistance on receiving your Clean Vehicle Rebate for you 2019 Chevrolet Bolt EV. I left you a voicemail a couple days ago saying I would look into it and circle around with you, and I've been in contact with the CA Air Resources Board (CARB) since then.

Unfortunately, I have some bad news. It is against the Clean Vehicle Rebate Project's policies outlined in the Implementation Manual (Page 6) to provide rebates for vehicles purchased or leased outside of California. According to the CARB, the purpose of this policy is for streamlined implementation their end, but more importantly to avoid fraudulent behavior by individuals who apply for multiple incentives in California, as well as another state. I asked if you were able to prove that you weren't applying for any other incentives, if it would make a difference, but I was also told no. Because the policies are adopted by the Board, CARB staff do not have the leeway to override the Board's direction.

You did bring this issue to our attention though, and we will be looking at we can do from our end to make some sort of rural exemption to this issue, seeing as you have a very valid argument regarding the lack of accessibility to dealerships in Northern California. I will be in touch with our legislative team to look at possible avenues for exploring some sort of administrative fix when it comes to this. Furthermore, since it seems to be based on the state that you make a purchase in, I would encourage you to circle back around with Oregon and see if you can still try and get a rebate from their end.

Rebate applications that have been denied or cancelled by the Administrator may be appealed within 10 days of the date of the cancellation. If the only basis for an appeal is that the applicant disagrees with the policies set forth in the CVRP Terms and Conditions and the Implementation Manual, there is no basis for an appeal.
