Housing California appreciates the opportunity to provide brief comments regarding the Draft Cap-and-Trade Auction Proceeds Third Investment Plan. We commend the California Air Resources Board for its ongoing leadership in addressing climate change. We agree with and fully support your position that that the foundation established by past budget appropriations, legislative direction, and the hard work of implementing the existing programs have produced tangible and important benefits.
