Re: 2016 Air Quality Management Plan for Ozone and PM2.5 for the South Coast Air Basin and the Coachella Valley

This letter is written and submitted on behalf of Southwest Airlines Co. (Southwest) to urge the California Air Resources Board (CARB) to withdraw the recent amendment to the 2016 Air Quality Management Plan for Ozone and PM2.5 for the South Coast Air Basin (Final AQMP) and the 2016 State Strategy for the State Implementation Plan (SIP Strategy). Southwest supports and incorporates by reference the comments submitted by Airlines for America® (A4A) on the Final AQMP and SIP Strategy. In particular, Southwest objects to the South Coast Air Quality Management District Governing Board's (District Board's) decision to amend measure MOB-04 – Emissions Reductions at Commercial Airports (MOB-04) by adding a sentence directing District Staff to develop an Indirect Source Rule (ISR) for commercial airports.¹

The District Board's decision to direct District Staff to develop an ISR was made without providing stakeholders a meaningful opportunity to evaluate and provide comments on the decision to amend measure MOB-04. Southwest has worked cooperatively with CARB since the early 1990's to implement zero and low emission equipment throughout the State of California to bring emissions associated with our ground support equipment fleet to levels well below fleet emission standards. Much of this progress has been made on a voluntary basis, often in consultation and cooperation with the industry and the regulators, and we feel that the District Board's proposal is contrary to our past positive working relationship.

Southwest understands and recognizes the significant and difficult responsibility CARB and the District Board have in developing and implementing clean air regulatory measures and respectfully urges CARB to direct the District Board to work cooperatively with affected
