The transportation sector emits 40% of the state?s greenhouse gas emissions and 80% of its smogforming NOx emissions. Medium and heavy-duty vehicles contribute a disproportionately high portion of this total.

CARB will hold its final hearing on the Advanced Clean Fleets rule April 27th to consider its approval. Simply put, this rule will require truck fleet owners to purchase increasing percentages of zero emission trucks over the next several years until their fleets are 100% ZEVs and would require 100% of all drayage trucks serving ports and railyards to be ZEV by 2035. The ACF rule builds on the approved Advanced Clean Trucks rule which requires manufacturers to have increasing percentages of their annual sales be zero emission trucks. The ACT rule is designed to create the supply of ZEV vehicles while the ACF rule will create the demand. These regulations are part of the state?s effort to transition 100% of the polluting trucks to zero.
