RE: Proposed Community Air Protection Funds Supplement to the Carl Moyer Memorial Air Quality Standards Attainment Program 2017 Guidelines

Dear Mr. Rowland:

Pacific Gas and Electric Company (PG&E) supports the Proposed Community Air Protection Funds Supplement to the Carl Moyer Memorial Air Quality Standards Attainment Program 2017 Guidelines (Carl Moyer Program Supplement) that incentivizes zero and near-zero transportation solutions to reduce near-term local mobile source emissions and statewide greenhouse gas emissions. These incentives will complement California Public Utility Commission (CPUC) - directed utility programs to expand transportation infrastructure solutions, including the following specific zero-emission infrastructure programs from PG&E:

1. \$130M investment over 3 years to install 7,500 workplace and multi-family dwelling Level 2 chargers,
2. Proposed \$211M investment over 5 years to install make-ready charging infrastructure for non-light duty electric fleets, and
3. Proposed \$22M investment to provide make-ready electricity infrastructure for DC Fast Charging in over 50 plazas along highway corridors and urban locations.

We also support the Board's incentives that encourage vehicle fleets to use renewable natural gas (e.g. bio-methane, landfill gas) in commercially available near-zero CNG vehicles, particularly in communities experiencing high levels of NOx and particulate matter exposure. Expanding and enhancing infrastructure in or near these locations will drive reductions in the pollution burden within these impacted communities.
