INTRODUCTION

The Associated General Contractors of America ("AGC") and the Construction Industry Air Quality Coalition ("CIAQC") respectfully submit these supplemental comments to the California Air Resources Board ("ARB") on its proposed in-use off-road diesel ("ORD") rule to respond to the supplemental data that ARB entered into the administrative record on March 5, 2008. In summary, AGC and CIAQC respectfully submit that the supplemental data do not support the ORD rule's cost effectiveness or feasibility.

AGC is the largest and most diverse trade association in the construction industry, with more than 32,000 members and 96 state and local chapters throughout the United States. Among AGC's members are more than 7,000 of the nation's leading general construction contractors and approximately 25,000 specialty contractors and other firms engaged in the construction of highways, bridges, tunnels, airport runways and terminals, buildings, factories, warehouses, shopping centers, and both water and wastewater treatment facilities.

CIAQC promotes the adoption and implementation of emission reduction measures that are cost-effective and efficient. Formed in 1989, CIAQC is a coalition of several major construction and building industry associations in California, including the Associated General Contractors of California and San Diego, the Building Industry Association of Southern California, the Engineering Contractors Association, the Engineering and General Contractors Association, the Engineering & Utility Contractors Association, Southern California Contractors Association and the California Dump Truck Owners Association. Associate and affiliate members include the Southern California Rock Products Association (now a part of the California Construction and Industrial Materials Association), the California Rental Association and the California Construction & Industrial Materials Association. Through its members, CIAQC represents several thousand member companies throughout California.

AGC and CIAQC previously submitted comments dated May 23, 2007, July 23, 2007, July 24, 2007, July 25, 2007, December 13, 2007, January 8, 2008, March 6, 2008, and March 12, 2008, which AGC and CIAQC incorporate by reference.

I. OVERSTATED USED-EQUIPMENT MARKET

As AGC and CIAQC have explained in their written comments and in conversations with ARB staff, significant differences exist in the markets in used, later-tier (*i.e.*, model year 2003 and subsequent) equipment, depending on the size of the equipment. Specifically, smaller, inexpensive, low-horsepower equipment turns over frequently (even absent an ORD rule), while larger, expensive, high-horsepower equipment does not. AGC Supplemental Comments, at 15-17 (Jan. 4, 2008); Affidavit of Michael Shaw, ¶4. As a result, the markets in those inherently different products differ.

ARB's cost-effectiveness and feasibility analyses depend on ARB's assessment of the availability of higher-tier used equipment to determine whether (and to what extent) low-cost used equipment can accommodate the ORD rule's accelerated turnover. If the used-equipment market is smaller than ARB anticipated (and AGC has demonstrated that it is more than five-fold smaller), California fleets will need either to purchase newer, more expensive equipment or to

downsize and (consequently) lose their economic ability to pay the ORD rule's significant costs. Either way, ARB's cost-effectiveness and feasibility analysis will be patently incorrect.

Like ARB's original used-equipment data, however, ARB's supplemental data fail to account for this important distinction between the markets in smaller versus larger units. Instead of breaking equipment availability down into the relevant subcategories of equipment, ARB's data rely on the MachineryTrader.com categories, which include wide ranges of equipment types. Shaw Affidavit, ¶4(h); Supplemental Affidavit of Lawrence J. Joseph, ¶¶4-5. In addition, like its prior data, ARB again includes an unknowable degree of irrelevant equipment (e.g., equipment under 25 horsepower, rental equipment, gray-market equipment, portable and onroad equipment subject to other rules). See Shaw Affidavit, ¶¶4(a)-(h), 5(a)-(j). These multiple failures bias ARB's assessment of the market in later-tier, higher-horsepower equipment, which in turn renders ARB's cost-effectiveness and economic-feasibility analyses plainly inaccurate.

Of course, if ARB is suggesting that the California construction industry replace large, higher-horsepower workhorse equipment with the readily available, low-horsepower equipment, ARB should say so. While that suggestion would be untenable, *see*, *e.g.*, Suppl. Joseph Affidavit, Ex. 1-17 (MachineryTrader.com listings for small equipment), it at least would be more straightforward than claiming that higher-tier, high-horsepower used equipment are readily available to support the accelerated demand that the ORD rule will impose.

In short, the supplemental data does nothing to bolster ARB's cost and feasibility analysis on the critical issue of the availability of later-tier, higher-horsepower equipment that the California construction industry will need to continue to perform its vital infrastructure functions.

II. CALIFORNIA ENVIRONMENTAL QUALITY ACT

Under its certified regulatory program, ARB must comply with the non-exempt portions of the California Environmental Quality Act ("CEQA"). *Mountain Lion Foundation v. Fish & Game Comm'n*, 16 Cal.4th 105, 132 (1997). Thus, while the California Administrative Procedure Act may allow supplementing the administrative record with only fifteen days for public comment, CEQA does not. *Ultramar, Inc. v. SCAQMD*, 17 Cal.App.4th 689, 699-702 (1993). ARB's truncated comment period prejudiced AGC and CIAQC, Shaw Affidavit, ¶6; Suppl. Joseph Affidavit, ¶7, and CEQA requires ARB to re-notice its rulemaking package.¹

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In addition, CEQA requires ARB to submit its draft environmental documents to the State Clearinghouse, Pub. Resources Code §21082.1(c)(4)(A)(i), which ARB has not done. Suppl. Joseph Affidavit, ¶6 & Ex. 19.

CONCLUSION

For all the foregoing reasons, the Board should recall the ORD rule from ARB staff, revisit the entire issue, reinitiate consultation with affected public agencies and stakeholders and expand its consideration of all less costly alternatives.

AFFIDAVIT OF MICHAEL R. SHAW

- I, Michael R. Shaw, hereby declare and state as follows:
- 1. I am over the age of 18, and I reside in La Mesa, California.
- 2. I am the president of Perry&Shaw, Inc., and a member of the Construction Industry Air Quality Coalition ("CIAQC"). Perry & Shaw, Inc. is a general engineering contractor licensed in the state of California specializing in heavy grading operations. I have been involved in the construction industry full time for 31 years.
- 3. Because I use the MachineryTrader.com regularly in my professional capacity, CIAQC asked me to review the supplemental data that the California Air Resources Board ("ARB") released on March 5, 2008, with its third supplemental notice on its in-use off-road diesel ("ORD") rulemaking.
- 4. From my knowledge of the MachineryTrader.com website and the used-equipment market, ARB's new data suffer from several problem s that make them inadequate to assess the market in used equipment available to help industry comply with the ORD rule:
 - a. ARB's MachineryTrader.com searches are over-inclusive because they include equipment with less than 25 horsepower ("HP"), which is exempt from the ORD rule.
 - b. ARB's MachineryTrader.com searches are over-inclusive because they include equipment that is not self-propelled, which is exempt from the ORD rule.

- c. ARB's MachineryTrader.com searches are over-inclusive because they include rental equipment, which would not necessarily be available for sale, and thus would not (except perhaps by rental) help California fleets comply with the ORD rule.
- d. To the extent that ARB relies on the worldwide totals and not the U.S. totals, ARB's MachineryTrader.com searches are over-inclusive because they include "gray market" foreign equipment not certified to federal or California standards, which would not help California fleets comply with the ORD rule.
- e. ARB's MachineryTrader.com searches are over-inclusive because they include non-diesel equipment (e.g., gas-powered and electric-powered equipment), which is not subject to the ORD rule and, more importantly, likely would not be an appropriate substitute for diesel-powered equipment in most construction contexts because of construction-specific issues such as the availability of fuel/power or the available torque/performance.
- f. ARB's MachineryTrader.com searches are over-inclusive because they include units subject to ARB regulations as onroad vehicles or portable equipment, which are exempt from the ORD rule.
- g. ARB's MachineryTrader.com search results are truncated to a single "screenshot" of each search, which do not include all of the units on that search page, much less all of the search pages generated for each search. Aside from then few units that appear on these screenshots, therefore, the reader cannot tell whether the equipment identified in the search actually is relevant or instead should have been excluded for one of the foregoing reasons (or some other reason that might be apparent if ARB had included the results of its searches).

- h. Because the MachineryTrader.com equipment categories are very broad, ARB's summary data do not distinguish between low-cost small units (e.g., under 175 HP) that industry would turn over regularly even without an ORD rule and the higher-cost, higher-HP large units that industry needs to complete large construction projects. For example, the Crawler Dozer and Crawler Excavator categories include equipment ranging from small Bobcat units available for rent for do-it-yourselfers to large Caterpillar D11 bulldozers. The small-equipment categories are significantly more available, both as a share of the total market in used equipment and with a higher degree of availability in later model years (i.e., 2003 and subsequent model years).
- 5. Although ARB's summary data includes very few of the more than 72,000 pieces of equipment that ARB's notice claims are available for sale worldwide, the pieces of equipment listed in ARB's new data demonstrate several of the foregoing defects in ARB's data set:
 - a. On page 40 (Compaction/Smooth Drum, USA, 2003+), ARB's search shows a 2007 Beuthling B60, which has a gas engine.
 - b. On page 130 (Excavator/Mini, Worldwide), ARB's search shows two pieces identified as AIRMAN AX15-2 with 17.3 HP (i.e., under the ORD rule's 25-HP minimum).
 - c. On page 136 (Excavator/Mini, USA, 2003+), all four machines shown in ARB's search are identified as BOBCAT 316 with 10 19 HP (i.e., under the ORD rule's 25-HP minimum).
 - d. On page 144 (Excavator/Wheel, USA, 2003+), the first unit in ARB's search is a towed unit (i.e., self propelled).
 - e. On page 160 (Forklift/Telescopic, USA, 2003+), the first unit in ARB's

search appears to be a rental unit (i.e., not for sale).

- f. On page 168 (Lift/Boom, USA, 2003+), the first unit in ARB's search is a 2004 AERIAL K-13, which is a tow-behind unit with an electric motor (i.e., neither self-propelled nor diesel-fueled).
- g. On page 176 (Lift/Scissor, USA, 2003+), all four machines shown in ARB's search are electric powered (i.e., not diesel-fueled).
- h. On page 184 (Loader/Backhoe, USA, 2003+), the first two of the three machines shown in ARB's search are gas powered (i.e., not diesel-fueled).
- i. On page 52 (Crane/Conventional Truck), the category includes onroad vehicles (which ARB regulates as an onroad vehicle) that either power their cranes from the vehicle's main engine or have a second engine that powers the crane (which ARB regulates as a portable engine).
- j. On page 200 (Pipelayer, USA, 2003+), the second of the three machines shown in ARB's search appears to be only an attachment (i.e., has no engine) because the underlying equipment (i.e., a 2005 Caterpillar 345BL) would cost several times more than \$55,000.
- 6. The short time in which I have had to review ARB's data precludes me from providing a more definitive or exhaustive analysis of ARB's new data and the issues that it presents.
- 7. I have personal knowledge of the foregoing and am competent to testify to it before the California Air Resources Board or at trial.

SUPPLEMENTAL AFFIDAVIT OF LAWRENCE J. JOSEPH

- I, Lawrence J. Joseph, hereby declare and state as follows:
- 1. I am over the age of 18, and I reside in McLean, Virginia.
- 2. I am an attorney representing the Associated General Contractors of America ("AGC") and the Construction Industry Air Quality Coalition ("CIAQC") in responding to the California Air Resources Board ("ARB") on in-use off-road diesel ("ORD") rulemaking. I am admitted to practice law in the District of Columbia and California.
- 3. CIAQC and AGC asked me to summarize the significance of ARB's supplemental data to the used-equipment market in later-model year (i.e., 2003+) used equipment of higher-horsepower. ARB provides only screenshots of the first page of its searches on the MachineryTrader.com website. While that method shows the number of "results" for the search at the top of the screen, it actually lists only a few of the items.
- 4. I reviewed ARB's categories on the MachineryTrader.com website on March 19 and 20, 2008, to identify the lower end of the range of horsepower covered by each category. Examples from MachineryTrader.com's (and thus ARB's) equipment categories that I printed from MachineryTrader.com are attached hereto as exhibits:

Ex 1: 2006 CATERPILLAR 904B (Wheel Loader).

Ex 2: 2004 GEHL AL20DX (Wheel Loader).

Ex 3: 2005 YANMAR B55W (Wheel Excavator).

Ex 4: 2003 BOBCAT V623 (Telescopic Lift).

Ex 5: 2004 DEERE 110 (Skip Loader).

Ex 6: 2007 ASV POSI-TRACK RCV (Skid Steer).

Ex 7: 2004 BOBCAT 463 (Skid Steer).

Ex 8: 2005 BOBCAT 325G (Mini Excavator).

Ex 9: 2007 CARTER CT18-7 (Mini Excavator).

Ex 10: 2004 BOBCAT B250T (Loader Backhoe).

Ex 11: 2007 KUBOTA BX24 (Loader Backhoe).

Ex 12: 2007 ASV SCOUT SC50 (Dumper).

Ex 13: 2007 CORMIDI C10.80AC (Dumper).

Ex 14: 2007 CASE 550H (Crawler Dozer).

Ex 15: 2005 BROKK 90 (Vertical Drill).

Ex 16: 2000 MEC 3072 (Scissor Lift).

Ex 17: 2004 BOBCAT BCA12S (Compaction-Smooth Drum).

- 5. All but two categories (Compaction-Landfill, and Wheel Dozer) included equipment under 175 horsepower. All but five categories (the foregoing two plus Crane-Rough Terrain, Pipelayer, and Scrap Processing-Demolition) included equipment under 100 horsepower. Nine categories included equipment under 25 horsepower). They are indicated in the attached spreadsheet (Ex. 18) with a "Yes" in the column headed with "<25HP."
- 6. On March 19, 2008, in my capacity as an attorney for AGC and CIAQC, I visited the website of the California Office of Planning and Research ("OPR") and queried the database of CEQA documents filed by ARB from January 2007 to that time. My search and results

(attached as Exhibit 19) indicate that ARB has not filed its ORD rulemaking documents with OPR.

- 7. The length of the comment period on ARB's third "15-day notice" has prejudiced AGC's and CIAQC's ability to review the relevant data and to prepare comments and supporting affidavits. In particular, the following issues prejudiced our ability to respond within the time provided: (1) the construction industry had its annual convention during the week of March 10, and many key players were unavailable for most of that week; (2) prior to the convention week, we devoted significant attention to meeting the March 6, 2008, comment deadline for ARB's prior 15-day comment period, and thus did not have a significant amount of time to devote to the new notice that came out on March 5, 2008; (3) my schedule included an appellate oral argument and a district-court dispositive motion, both on March 18, 2008; (4) several key members of our legal team had illness within their family during the notice period.
- 8. I have personal knowledge of the foregoing and am competent to testify to it before the California Air Resources Board or at trial.
