EXECUTIVE ORDER A-14-71
Relating to Certification of New Motor Vehicles

TOYOTA MOTOR CORPORATION

Pursuant to the authority vested in the Air Resources Board by the Health and Safety Code, Division 26, Part 5, Chapter 2; and

Pursuant to the authority vested in the undersigned by Health and Safety Code Sections 39515 and 39516 and Executive Orders G-45-3 and G-45-4;

IT IS ORDERED AND RESOLVED: That 1985 model-year Toyota Motor Corporation exhaust emission control systems are certified as described below for diesel-powered passenger cars:
