

Verified Diesel Emission Control Strategy Information (VDECS) Page

This guide provides the definitions for the information required on the ‘Enter VDECS’ page of the Diesel Off-road Online Reporting System (DOORS), which is the reporting system for the In-Use Off-road Diesel Vehicle Regulation. Below is a screen shot of the ‘Enter VDECS’ page, and then following that, a table that provides a description/definition for each field.

Note: You will only be able to enter VDECS information if you have already entered the vehicle and engine information.

Field	Definition
Veh serial num	This is the vehicle serial number that was entered on the ‘Enter Vehicle’ page.
Your veh num (optional)	This is the vehicle identifier that was entered on the ‘Enter Vehicle’ page.
Eng serial num	This is the engine serial number that was entered on the ‘Enter Engine’ page.
VDECS serial num	The VDECS serial number should be listed on the VDECS label or the information provided by the VDECS manufacturer or installer. VDECS serial numbers are unique and may not repeat. If you have repeating serial numbers or your serial number is too long or short to fit in this field, please see the “Reporting with Repeating Serial Numbers” DOORS User Guide, which is available in the Off-Road regulation Knowledge Center at: http://www.arb.ca.gov/msprog/ordiesel/knowcenter.htm
Date VDECS Purchased	The date the VDECS was purchased.

Field	Definition
Date VDECS installed	The date the VDECS was installed.
VDECS Family Name	<p>The VDECS family name should be listed on the VDECS label or the information provided by the VDECS manufacturer or installer. Select the correct VDECS from the dropdown list.</p> <p>If your device is not listed, contact ARB at doors@arb.ca.gov to ensure that you are using a VDECS that is verified for your engine.</p>
