

Vehicle Information Page

This guide provides the definitions for the information required on the 'Enter Vehicle' page of the Diesel Off-road Online Reporting System (DOORS), which is the reporting system for the In-Use Off-road Diesel Vehicle Regulation. Below is a screen shot of the 'Enter Vehicle' page, and then following that, a table that provides a description/definition for each field.

Note: You will only be able to report vehicle information if you have already entered the owner information (on the 'Edit Owner' page).

Field	Definition
Veh serial num	<p>The vehicle serial number of the vehicle. For vehicles with on-road engines, please enter the vehicle identification number (VIN).</p> <p>The vehicle serial number should be available on the vehicle label, a bill of sale, or other records. Vehicle serial numbers are unique, and may not repeat. If you have repeating serial numbers, please see the 'How to Report with Repeating Serial Numbers' DOORS User Guide which is available in the Off-Road regulation Knowledge Center at: http://www.arb.ca.gov/msprog/ordiesel/knowcenter.htm</p>
Your veh num (optional)	An optional field for a personal vehicle identifier, or a license plate.
Type	<p>The vehicle type has a dropdown menu with categories of vehicles. You must select one category from the list to describe the vehicle.</p> <p>GSE is a designation that should be used for airport ground support equipment (GSE) only.</p>

Field	Definition
Manufacturer	The vehicle manufacturer field has a dropdown menu with vehicle manufacturers listed. Check the different variations of your manufacturer name. For example, if you do not find “John Deere”, look for “Deere”. If your vehicle manufacturer is not listed, choose “OTHER.”
Model	The vehicle model should be listed on the vehicle or the instruction manual.
MY (model year)	The vehicle model year refers to the year in which the vehicle was manufactured. This model year will not be used to calculate engine emissions; the engine model year will be used to determine emissions.
Emergency	<p>If a vehicle is used solely for emergency operations, it must be reported and labeled, but will have no other requirements under the Off-Road regulation.</p> <p>Emergency operations means helping alleviate an immediate threat to public health or safety. Examples of emergency operation include repairing or preventing damage to roads, buildings, terrain, and infrastructure as a result of an earthquake, flood, storm, fire, other infrequent act of nature, or terrorism. Routine maintenance or construction to prevent public health risks does not constitute emergency operation.</p> <p>If the vehicle is used solely for emergency services, use the drop-down menu to select ‘Yes.’</p>
Snow removal	<p>A vehicle is considered a dedicated snow removal vehicle if it is operated exclusively to remove snow from public roads, private roads, or other paths from which snow must be cleared to allow on-road vehicle access. Privately owned dedicated snow removal vehicles <u>must</u> have permanently affixed snow removal equipment such as a snow blower or auger; however, a publically owned vehicle is not required to have a permanently affixed attachment. Dedicated snow removal vehicles must be reported and labeled, but will have no other requirements under the Off-Road regulation. Two-engine dedicated snow removal vehicles are completely exempt from the Off-Road regulation, and have no reporting requirements.</p> <p>If the vehicle is a dedicated snow removal vehicle, use the drop-down menu to select ‘Yes.’</p>

Field	Definition
<p>Agriculture*</p> <p>*For vehicles used a majority of the time (but not solely) for agricultural operations, the fleet must report hours of use for these vehicles each year that reporting is required.</p>	<p>If a vehicle is used a majority of the time, but not solely, for agricultural operations, it must be reported and labeled, but will have no other requirements under the Off-Road regulation.</p> <p>Vehicles used solely for agricultural operations are completely exempt from the Off-Road regulation, and do <u>not</u> have to be reported or labeled.</p> <p>If the vehicle is used a majority of the time, but not solely, for agricultural operations, use the drop-down menu to select 'Yes.'</p> <p>Note also that fleets must report the hours of use for these vehicles each year. <p>Non-diesel</p>	<p>Is the vehicle an alternative fuel vehicle? Use the drop-down menu to select 'Yes' or 'No.'</p>
<p>SOON</p>	<p>Is this vehicle currently under a contract in the Surplus Off-road Opt-in for NOx (SOON) program? If so, indicate which district maintains a contract for this vehicle. If the contract period has expired, select "No".</p>
<p>Moyer</p>	<p>Is this vehicle currently under a contract in the Carl Moyer Incentive Funding program? If so, indicate which district maintains a contract for this vehicle. If the contract period has expired, select "No".</p>
<p>Demo</p>	<p>Has the vehicle participated in a retrofit or other emissions reduction demonstration program aside from the SOON and Moyer programs? If so, indicate which district maintains a contract for this vehicle.</p>
<p>Awaiting Sale</p>	<p>Vehicles in the possession of dealers, financing companies, or other entities who do not intend to operate the vehicle nor offer the vehicle for hire, that are operated only to demonstrate functionality to potential buyers or to move short distances while awaiting sale for maintenance purposes are exempt from all requirements of the regulation.</p> <p>Vehicles awaiting sale are not required to be reported, but if you wish to report an awaiting sale vehicle, use the drop-down menu to select 'Yes.'</p>

Field	Definition
Island	<p>Vehicles used solely on San Nicolas or San Clemente Islands are exempt from all requirements of the regulation.</p> <p>Vehicles operated on the islands above are not required to be reported, but if you wish to report a vehicle that is used exclusively on the San Clemente or San Nicholas islands, use the drop-down menu to select 'Yes.'</p>
Loan	<p>If a vehicle is not subject to the Off-road regulation, but is required to obtain an Equipment Identification Number (EIN) through the ARB/California Capital Access Program (CalCAP) loan program, use the drop-down menu to select 'Yes.'</p>
