

More solar in the Desert! Victor Valley College flips switch on solar panels and clean tech training

ARB's Barbara Riordan recognizes "that the greening of California's economy is not all talk"

On May 25, 2010, California Air Resources Board and Mojave Desert Air Quality Management District member Barbara Riordan flipped the switch on the largest solar array of its kind in North America at Victor Valley College in Victorville, Calif. The new solar technology reduces the use of valuable water and land resources and will generate 30 percent of the college's annual power needs.

The college also announced its commitment to add solar technology training to its curriculum – preparing today's students to be the skilled workers in California's clean energy present and future.
