<p><b>DUTIES:</b></p> <p><b>Due to the Governor's Hiring Freeze Order, only internal Air Resources Board lateral candidates will be considered.</b></p> <p>The Enforcement Division is seeking highly qualified and motivated Air Pollution Specialist/Air Resources Engineer to work in the Fuels Enforcement Section. The Enforcement Division seeks to protect public health and provide safe, clean air to all Californians by reducing emissions of air contaminants through the fair, consistent and comprehensive enforcement of statutory and regulatory requirements.</p> <p>The ARB's Fuels Enforcement Program is responsible for ensuring that motor vehicles fuels meet the standards established in California's fuels regulations. Inspections of motor vehicle fuels are conducted by inspectors at all points of the distribution chain, from manufacturers and importers to retail facilities as well as vapor recover systems. The fuels program is also responsible for investigation and research into existing and self-reported violations, evaluation of alternative compliance data, and the development of motor vehicle fuels cases. The ARB's Fuels Enforcement Section is also responsible for the inspection of cargo tanks and vapor recovery systems to ensure compliance with State standards.</p> <p>The Fuels Enforcement Program is also responsible for providing valuable outreach in the form of training seminars, individual company meetings, instructive web pages, and ongoing support to refiners, importers and regulators. This support helps to clarify complex aspects of the regulations and inform the regulated community about alternative compliance options. Successful candidate for this position will be expected to be available to travel up to 50 percent of their work schedule. Candidate with a background in or thorough understanding of enforcement operations are encouraged to apply.</p> <p><b>DESIRABLE QUALIFICATIONS:</b> An applicant for a position in the Fuels Enforcement Section must take and pass a physical exam which includes a lung function test. You will be expected to receive training and become certified to use a respirator and self contained breathing apparatus (SCBA). You will be expected to wear the approximately 40 pound SCBA while climbing flights of stairs and angled ladders to heights up to 75 feet while carrying an additional 20 pounds of equipment. You must have a valid California driver's license. Candidates will need to pass a TSA background security check and qualify for a Transportation Worker Identification Credential (TWIC) as a condition of employment.</p> <p>The candidate must have a strong technical background and, excellent communication, writing, and interpersonal and project management skills. The most successful applicant will possess the ability to work both independently and cooperatively with other staff and agencies; meet deadlines; follow written and verbal instructions; use tact and good judgment in dealing with people; apply good customer service techniques; and work effectively under pressure. Applicants should be familiar with Microsoft Office and Windows; work flexible hours as needed.
