The section is responsible for the development and implementation of regulations designed to reduce emissions of criteria, toxic, and greenhouse gas emissions. The supervisor of this section will oversee and coordinate staff conducting technical evaluations and studies to determine feasibility, cost-effectiveness, environmental impacts, and socio-economic impacts of potential control strategies and regulations. In addition, the section provides assistance to local districts and others in the development and implementation of stationary source control measures. The successful applicant will work with a broad spectrum of stakeholders, including federal, state, and local government agencies, affected industries, and the public, during the development and/or implementation of these programs and activities.</p>			
<p>DESIRABLE QUALIFICATIONS:</p> <p>The successful candidate will have strong leadership skills, be able to write and speak clearly and effectively, and have exceptional interpersonal skills. The candidate must possess a high level of knowledge of mobile and stationary source emissions and controls, a working knowledge of local, state, and federal stationary source requirements and programs, and the ability to analyze complex technical issues.
