<p>Due to the Governor's Hiring Freeze Order, only Internal Air Resources Board candidates will be considered.</p> <p>DUTIES: GOODS MOVEMENT AND PUBLIC HEALTH. Are you interested in regional and global freight transport policy and technical issues, and participating in a program to cut diesel emissions that delivers tangible, near-term public health benefits? We are looking for two team members join us in this high visibility program.</p> <p>As part of this team you will participate in the implementation and update of the Goods Movement Emission Reduction Program, which uses \$1 billion from Proposition 1B to provide incentives to accelerate the cleanup of the diesel trucks, locomotives, ships, harbor craft, and equipment that move cargo throughout the State. Our charge is to run an effective incentive program with air districts and ports to reduce the health risk from these sources, consistent with legislative criteria, Board policies, and numerous ARB regulations. Current program priorities include resolving technical and policy questions on implementation; seeking the next installments of funding as the State is able to sell bonds; adapting the initial program to quickly respond to today's realities; and coordinating with other ARB divisions and air districts to streamline and improve access to truck incentive programs. In addition, this group works with other agencies, seaports, affected communities and industries on regional air quality plans, policies, and strategies for goods movement operations. We are also getting involved in some climate change activities as they relate to goods movement and the efficiency of the freight transport system.</p> <p>Duties may include: leading multi-division technical teams on incentive program implementation including providing assistance on eligibility for funding emission control technologies; coordinating with local and other state agencies on program implementation, monitoring, enforcement, and auditing; advising ARB management on goods movement policies; analyzing and interpreting data on emissions and health risk to recommend optimum project mix and assess progress; tracking the development of regulations and other initiatives to reduce goods movement emissions; preparing and presenting comprehensive progress reports on California's air quality program for goods movement; working with other ARB experts to evaluate technology proposals; developing and refining bond program database requirements and business processes; conducting public outreach; developing, negotiating, and overseeing large grants; and representing ARB in numerous public forums.</p> <p>DESIRABLE QUALIFICATIONS: Looking for two self-motivated individuals with creative, agile, and analytical minds. Strategic thinking skills are essential. Scientific or engineering background preferred, with experience in one or more of the following areas: the goods movement industry, transportation planning, diesel engine controls, financial analysis, database design and management, and air quality program development. The most competitive applicants will have the demonstrated ability to: hit the ground running; anticipate program needs and initiate solutions; write concisely and effectively in every day language; communicate persuasively with agency/industry executives and community members; critically evaluate technical data and perform accurate analyses with limited information; generate high-quality products in short timeframes; work productively in project teams, both as a team member and a team leader; elicit cooperation from a wide variety of stakeholders; maintain a sense of humor under pressure; and travel within the State.</p> <p>Air Pollution Specialists and qualified candidates in other classifications are encouraged to apply.
