
The Air Resources Board (ARB or Board) is transmitting to the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (U.S. EPA) the California Regional Haze Plan 2014 Progress Report (Report). The Report demonstrates that California's control strategy for reducing regional haze pollutants and their precursors is effective. As a result, the State's 2018 visibility goals have been achieved ahead of schedule at many Class 1 areas and we are on track to meet our longer term goals for improved visibility.

The Board approved the Report at a public hearing on May 22, 2014. Enclosed is the following documentation, including two hard copies of the following materials, with an exact electronic copy of each:

1. Public notice and transcript for the ARB Public Hearing to consider approval of the Report;
