Dear Mr. Nasti:

The Air Resources Board (ARB or Board) is pleased to submit to the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (U.S. EPA) for approval as a revision to the California State Implementation Plan (SIP) the San Joaquin Valley's local element of the SIP for 8-hour ozone. The San Joaquin Valley Air Pollution Control District (District) adopted the plan on April 30, 2007. On June 14, 2007, ARB approved the plan as a revision to the California SIP.

The SIP revision relies on reduction commitments from the 2007 State Strategy for the California SIP (State Strategy), which the Board adopted on September 27, 2007. The State Strategy is being submitted under separate cover as it also applies to other California nonattainment areas.

The SIP revision demonstrates attainment of the federal 8-hour ozone standard in the San Joaquin Valley by 2023. It includes an emission reduction commitment for long-term measures as allowed by Section 182(e)(5) of the Act. ARB concurs with the District's request for reclassification from "serious" to "extreme" for the 8-hour ozone standard.



This SIP submittal includes revisions to the San Joaquin Valley transportation conformity emissions budgets. ARB requests that U.S. EPA act quickly to find the transportation conformity budgets adequate for use by Valley transportation planning agencies. To ensure that any future updates to these budgets are used expeditiously in the conformity process, we also request that U.S. EPA allow budgets to be replaced upon a finding of adequacy. To accomplish this, we ask U.S. EPA to limit its approval of the budgets submitted today to last only until the effective date of future U.S. EPA adequacy findings for replacement budgets.

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We look forward to working with you to secure the approval of this SIP revision, and will continue to work with your staff to resolve technical issues related to U.S. EPA approval.
