# A RESOLUTION OF THE GOVERNING BOARD OF THE ANTELOPE VALLEY AIR QUALITY MANAGEMENT DISTRICT MAKING FINDINGS, CERTIFYING THE NOTICE OF EXEMPTION, ADOPTING THE FEDERAL 8-HOUR OZONE ATTAINMENT PLAN (WESTERN **MOJAVE DESERT NON-ATTAINMENT AREA) AND DIRECTING STAFF ACTIONS.**

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On May 20, 2008, on motion by Member MCCOY, seconded by Member HAWKINS, and carried, the following resolution is adopted:

WHEREAS, the Antelope Valley Air Quality Management District (AVAQMD) has authority pursuant to California Health and Safety Code (H & S Code) §§40702, 40725-40728 to adopt, amend or repeal rules and regulations; and

WHEREAS, on March 9, 2006, USEPA shifted its ozone standard from measurement on a one-9 10 hour basis to an eight hour basis (8-hour ozone standard); and

WHEREAS, the United States Environmental Protection Agency (USEPA) designated the 11 Western Mojave Desert non-attainment area as non-attainment for the 8-hour ozone National Ambient Air 12 13 Quality Standard (NAAQS) pursuant to the provisions of the Federal Clean Air Act (FCAA); and WHEREAS, the AVAQMD is included in the Western Mojave Desert non-attainment area; and 14 WHEREAS, the AVAQMD and its predecessor agencies have adopted State and Federal 15 16 attainment plans for the region to comply with the one-hour ozone designation within its jurisdiction; and

17 WHEREAS, the most recent such plan that was approved by USEPA is the AVAQMD 2004 Ozone Attainment Plan adopted in 2004 to comply with the 8-hour ozone planning requirements; and 18 WHEREAS, the AVAQMD has reviewed and updated all elements of the AVAQMD 2004 19 Ozone Attainment Plan adopted in 2004; and 20 21 WHEREAS, the AVAQMD will be in attainment of the 8-hour NAAQS for ozone by 2021; and WHEREAS, the Federal 8-Hour Ozone Attainment Plan (Western Mojave Desert Non-22 Attainment Area) includes the latest planning assumptions regarding population, vehicle activity and 23 industrial activity within the jurisdiction of the AVAQMD; and 24 WHEREAS, the Federal 8-Hour Ozone Attainment Plan (Western Mojave Desert Non-25 Attainment Area) addresses all existing and forecast ozone precursor-producing activities within the 26 jurisdiction of the AVAQMD through the year 2020; and 27 28 Page 1 of 1

WHEREAS, the Federal 8-Hour Ozone Attainment Plan (Western Mojave Desert Non-Attainment Area) includes all necessary information to allow general and transportation conformity findings to be made within the Antelope Valley; and

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WHEREAS, the proposed adoption of the Federal 8-Hour Ozone Attainment Plan (Western Mojave Desert Non-Attainment Area) is necessary to update AVAQMD planning to include the latest planning assumptions regarding population, vehicle activity and industrial activity; addresses all existing and forecast ozone precursor-producing activities within the Antelope Valley through the year 2020; and includes all necessary information to allow general and transportation conformity findings to be made within the Antelope Valley; and

WHEREAS, the AVAQMD has the authority pursuant to H & S Code §40702 to do such acts as
 may be necessary or proper to execute the powers and duties granted to, and imposed upon, the District by
 this division and other statutory provisions; and

WHEREAS, the proposed adoption of the Federal 8-Hour Ozone Attainment Plan (Western
 Mojave Desert Non-Attainment Area) is clear in that the meaning can be easily understood by the persons
 impacted by the Plan; and

WHEREAS, the proposed adoption of the Federal 8-Hour Ozone Attainment Plan (Western

Mojave Desert Non-Attainment Area) is in harmony with, and not in conflict with, or contradictory to 17 18 existing statutes, court decisions, or state or federal regulations because the AVAQMD has experienced ambient ozone concentrations in excess of the 8-hour ozone NAAQS and this document: (1) demonstrates 19 that the AVAQMD will meet the primary required Federal ozone planning milestones, attainment of the 20 21 8-hour ozone NAAQS by June 2021; (2) presents the progress the AVAQMD will make towards meeting 22 all required ozone planning milestones; and (3) discusses the newest 0.075 part per million 8-hour ozone NAAQS, preparatory to an expected non-attainment designation for the new NAAQS. This document 23 satisfies 42 U.S.C. §§7410, 7502, 7504 and 7511a (FCAA §§110, 172, 174, and 182) regarding 24 25 implementation plans, non-attainment plan provisions, planning procedures, and ozone plan submissions and requirements for the 8-hour NAAQS; and 26

WHEREAS, the proposed adoption of the Federal 8-Hour Ozone Attainment Plan (Western
 Mojave Desert Non-Attainment Area) does not impose the same requirements as any existing state or

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federal regulation because USEPA has revoked the one-hour standard which was the basis for all previous ozone plans. The proposed plan is being promulgated in response to the new 8-hour ozone standard. As a result, this document replaces the obsolete one-hour plan; and

WHEREAS, the proposed adoption is needed because this document includes the latest planning assumptions regarding population, vehicle activity and industrial activity; addresses all existing and forecast ozone precursor-producing activities within the Antelope Valley through the year 2020; and includes all necessary information to allow general and transportation conformity findings to be made within the Antelope Valley; and

WHEREAS, a public hearing has been properly noticed and conducted, pursuant to H & S Code
 §40725, concerning the proposed adoption of the Federal 8-Hour Ozone Attainment Plan (Western
 Mojave Desert Non-Attainment Area); and

WHEREAS, a Notice of Exemption, a Categorical Exemption (Class 8, 14 CCR §15308) for the proposed adoption of the Federal 8-Hour Ozone Attainment Plan (Western Mojave Desert Non-Attainment Area), completed in compliance with the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA), has been presented to the AVAQMD Board; each member having reviewed, considered and approved the information contained therein prior to acting on the proposed adoption of the Federal 8-Hour Ozone

- Attainment Plan (Western Mojave Desert Non-Attainment Area), and the AVAQMD Board having 17 determined that the proposed adoption will not have any potential for resulting in any adverse impact 18 19 upon the environment; and 20 WHEREAS, the Board has considered the evidence presented at the public hearing; and NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Governing Board of the AVAQMD finds 21 22 that the proposed adoption of the Federal 8-Hour Ozone Attainment Plan (Western Mojave Desert Non-23 Attainment Area) is necessary, authorized, clear, consistent, non-duplicative and properly referenced; and BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Governing Board of the AVAQMD hereby makes a 24 finding that the Class 8 Categorical Exemption (14 CCR §15308) applies and certifies the Notice of 25
- 26 <u>Exemption</u> for the proposed adoption of the Federal 8-Hour Ozone Attainment Plan (Western Mojave 27 Desert Non-Attainment Area); and

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BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Board of the AVAQMD does hereby adopt, pursuant to the authority granted by law, the proposed adoption of the *Federal 8-Hour Ozone Attainment Plan* (Western Mojave Desert Non-Attainment Area), as set forth in the attachments to this resolution and incorporated herein by this reference; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that this resolution shall take effect immediately upon adoption,
that the Clerk of the Board is directed to file the Notice of Exemption in compliance with the provisions
of CEQA.
