Re: Reasonably Available Control Technology (RACT) State Implementation Plan (SIP) Revision

Dear Mr. Corey,

The Feather River Air Quality Management District Board of Directors has adopted the attached Resolution #2014-10 adopting RACT Analysis and Negative Declaration Staff Report. This has been prepared in regards to Clean Air Act Sections 182(b)(2) and 182(f) for the south Sutter County portion of the Sacramento Metro nonattainment area.

As a severe nonattainment area for the 2008 8-hour ozone national ambient air quality standard, the District is required to adopt Reasonably Available Control Technology for all major sources of ozone precursors, and smaller sources that meet Control Techniques Guidelines applicability. The District staff have reviewed the sources in this portion of the nonattainment area and determined that there are no major sources of ozone precursors and that the District's rules are as stringent as the CTG's for the applicable source type.

Please transmit the RACT SIP revision to the US EPA as a revision to the 8-hour ozone SIP. If you have any questions, please have your staff contact Sondra Spaethe at (530) 634-7659 ext 210.
