NOTICE OF PUBLIC MEETING TO CONSIDER THE OZONE SIP FOR SAN DIEGO COUNTY

The Air Resources Board (ARB or Board) will conduct a public meeting at the time and place noted below to consider the adoption of the *8-Hour Ozone Attainment Plan for San Diego County* (Plan) developed by the San Diego County Air Pollution Control District (District). If adopted, ARB will submit the Plan to the United States Environmental Protection Agency (U.S. EPA) as a revision to the California State Implementation Plan (SIP)

This item will be considered at a two-day meeting of the Board, which will commence at 9:00 a.m., March 23, 2017. This item is scheduled to be heard on the Board's Consent Calendar. All agenda items on the Consent Calendar – unless removed upon the request of a Board member or if someone in the audience submits a request to speak card on that item – will be voted on by the Board at the beginning of the public meeting.

Background

The federal Clean Air Act (CAA) establishes planning requirements for areas that exceed the health-based National Ambient Air Quality Standards (NAAQS). These nonattainment areas must develop and implement a SIP that demonstrates how they will attain the standard by specified dates.

In 2008, U.S. EPA strengthened the 8-hour ozone NAAQS (Standard) to 75 parts per billion. Effective June 3, 2016, U.S. EPA designated San Diego County a Moderate nonattainment area. The District must develop and implement a plan that addresses Moderate planning requirements and demonstrates attainment of the Standard by July 2018. The District prepared the Plan to address these requirements, and the District Governing Board approved the Plan on December 14, 2016. The Plan includes emission inventories, an attainment demonstration, a reasonable further progress demonstration, an assessment of reasonably available control measures and technologies, and identification of contingency measures if San Diego County fails to meet a reasonable further progress milestone or attain the standard. The Plan also includes motor vehicle transportation conformity budgets developed using the EMFAC2014 emissions model that reflects the latest planning assumptions. The ARB

staff report on the Plan also includes additional documentation on the emissions inventory for the San Diego nonattainment area required for U.S. EPA to take action on the Plan.

ARB staff has reviewed the Plan and concluded that together with the additional inventory documentation in the ARB staff report, it meets the applicable requirements in the Act.

Proposed Action

ARB staff recommends that the Board adopt the 8-Hour Ozone Attainment Plan for San Diego County and direct staff to submit the Plan to U.S. EPA as a revision to the California SIP.

ARB staff has prepared a written report. 
