Subject: 1998 Clean Air Plan for Santa Barbara County

Enclosed are three copies of the revisions to the State of California Implementation Plan (SIP) for ozone in Santa Barbara County. This submittal consists of the following materials:

- A. January 21, 1999, correspondence from the Santa Barbara County Air Pollution Control District (District) including attachments and enclosures:
 1. The District's adopted Clean Air Plan including the following appendices:
 - Appendix A, Emissions Inventory and Forecasting Document
 - Appendix B, Stationary Source Control Measure Working Papers
 - Appendix C, Transportation Control Measures On-Road Mobile Source Emissions Analysis
 - Appendix D, Ozone Attainment Demonstration.
 2. District Resolution 98-21 approving and adopting the Santa Barbara County 1998 Clean Air Plan, dated December 29, 1998.
 3. Proof of publication of the District's 1998 CAP
- B. February 5, 1999, correspondence from the Santa Barbara County Air Pollution Control District committing to implement the photochemical air monitoring stations program are required in 40 Code of Federal Regulations, part 58.
- C. January 6, 1999, correspondence from the Santa Barbara County Air Pollution Control District requesting ARB submit the 1998 Clean Air Plan as a revision to the Santa Barbara County portion of the California SIP.
- D. Executive Order 99-2a of the California Air Resources Board (ARB or Board), approving the 1998 Clean Air Plan as a revision to the SIP.


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- E. Completed checklist for applicable SIP completeness criteria as defined in 40 CFR Part 51, Appendix V.

Under section 181(a) of the Act, Santa Barbara County was to attain the federal ozone standard by 1996. However, violations of the standard prevented Santa Barbara County from attaining the standard and as a result the District was reclassified from a "moderate" to a "serious" ozone nonattainment on December 10, 1997. This action required that the District prepare a SIP revision to address planning requirements for "serious" nonattainment areas. In December 1998, the Santa Barbara County District board adopted the 1998 Clean Air Plan which revised the District's 1994 ozone attainment demonstrations, conformity emissions budgets, and added the post-1996 rate-of-progress demonstrations. In addition, the 1998 Clean Air Plan includes updates to the District's ozone modeling and improvements to its emissions inventories.
