



Want To Save Time And Money? Want To Be More Competitive?

Do You Own or Operate Portable Equipment?

The California Air Resources Board has made some important changes to the Portable Equipment Registration Program (PERP) that provide greater flexibility to portable equipment owners and operators. These changes will also save valuable time and money making your business more competitive.

Some examples of portable equipment are air compressors, generators, concrete pumps, tub grinders, wood chippers, water pumps, drill rigs, pile drivers, rock drills, abrasive blasters, aggregate screening and crushing plants, concrete batch plants, and welders.


PERP is a voluntary statewide program to register portable equipment. Portable equipment registered in PERP may operate throughout the state without obtaining permits from any of California's 35 air quality management or air pollution control districts.

For a limited time, owners and operators of older, dirtier certified engines may register in PERP. The portable equipment must have resided in California between March 1, 2004 and October 1, 2006. This opportunity ends on December 31, 2009. **Do not wait! Early applicants pay less!**

Uncertified engines (Tier 0) are not eligible to register in PERP. (However, at the discretion of the air pollution control officer, a local air pollution district may permit Tier 0 engines).

Still not convinced PERP is for you?

Remember, to operate portable equipment in California you must have an air district permit or PERP registration. Recently, California air districts received a significant increase in funds for their enforcement activities. It is very likely that the owners and operators of unregistered or unpermitted engines will be cited and fined. **Avoid being penalized! Register today!**
