NOTICE EXTENDING PUBLIC COMMENT PERIOD BY 15 CALENDAR DAYS REGARDING THE CALIFORNIA ENVIRONMENTAL QUALITY ACT FUNCTIONALLY EQUIVALENT ENVIRONMENTAL DOCUMENT:

THE DOCUMENT EVALUATES THE POTENTIAL ENVIRONMENTAL IMPACTS ASSOCIATED WITH THE 2010 COMMITMENTS BETWEEN THE AIR RESOURCES BOARD AND UNION PACIFIC RAILROAD (UP) AND BNSF RAILWAY (BNSF) TO FURTHER REDUCE DIESEL PARTICULATE MATTER EMISSIONS AT THE BNSF SAN BERNARDINO AND HOBART RAILYARDS AND THE UP COMMERCE AND ICTF/DOLORES RAILYARDS

The public comment period was originally scheduled for 45 calendar days from July 5, 2011 to August 19, 2011 at 5:00 p.m. The Air Resources Board (ARB) is extending the public comment period to September 6, 2011 at 5:00 p.m. This extension applies to the California Environmental Quality Act Functional Equivalent Document (FED) for the proposed project to approve and implement the 2010 Commitments, as revised (Revised 2010 Commitments), between ARB and UP and BNSF to further reduce diesel particulate matter (PM) emissions at the four high-priority railyards (identified below). The FED is contained in Appendix F of the document entitled *Supplement to the June 2010 Staff Report on Proposed Actions to Further Reduce Diesel Particulate Matter at High-Priority California Railyards*, July 5, 2011.

The proposed project's primary purpose is to improve the existing air quality environment surrounding the covered railyards and reduce health risk to residents of the surrounding communities from railyard emissions of diesel PM. The Revised 2010 Commitments for each high-priority railyard include:

- A declining cap on railyard diesel PM emissions from 2011-2020, irrespective of economic growth and related increases in the number of containers handled;
- An 85 percent reduction in diesel PM emissions between 2005 and 2020;
- In 2020, additional emission reductions of about 35-70 percent beyond the benefits of the existing program of regulations and agreements; and
- A clear and prompt trigger for ARB regulatory and other appropriate federal legislative and regulatory action if railroads do not meet the commitments.

Although the execution and implementation of the Revised 2010 Commitments do not directly and adversely affect the physical environment, ARB has determined that operational changes that may be undertaken by the railroads to meet the emission reduction targets or reduce health risk have the potential to result in changes to the physical environment in the vicinity of the railyards. ARB determined that these changes may result in potentially significant adverse impacts to aesthetics (light), noise, and transportation/traffic.

Comments: Interested members of the public may present comments on this Functional Equivalent Document in writing. The public comment period was originally scheduled for 45 calendar days from July 5, 2011 to August 19, 2011 at 5:00 p.m. This notice extends the public comment period, by at least 15 calendar days, to September 6, 2011 at 5:00 pm. In accordance with ARB's certified regulatory program, staff will respond in writing to all significant environmental issues raised during the comment period and the ARB Executive Officer will consider those comments and responses prior to final action on the Revised 2010 Commitments. After the Executive Officer makes a decision on this proposed project, ARB will post the notice of final action and the written responses to comments on ARB's website and file them with the Secretary of the Natural Resources Agency for public inspection.
