AIR RESOURCES BOARD

Executive Order G-95-102

WHEREAS, on July 27, 1995, the Air Resources Board (the "Board") conducted a public hearing to consider the adoption of amendments to the certification procedures for all on-road motor vehicle retrofits and adoption of optional retrofit emission standards for heavy-duty engines and vehicles;

WHEREAS, following the public hearing, the Board adopted Resolution 95-39, in which the Board approved adoption of Title 13, California Code of Regulations, section 1956.9, and amendment of sections 2030 and 2031, and the documents incorporated by reference, as set forth in Attachment A thereto;

WHEREAS, the Board, in Resolution 95-39, directed the Executive Officer to adopt and amend the regulations, after making them available to the public for a period of 15 days, provided that the Executive Office shall consider such written comments regarding the modifications as may be submitted during this period, shall make modifications as may be appropriate in light of the comments received, and shall present the regulations to the Board for further consideration if he determines that this is warranted;

WHEREAS, the approved regulations were available for public comment for a period of 15 days, with the changes to the originally proposed text clearly indicated, in accordance with the provisions of Title 1, California Code of Regulations, section 44; and

WHEREAS, the written comments received during this 15-day period have been considered by the Executive Officer and do not require modification nor reconsideration by the Board of the approved regulations.

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED that the recitals and findings contained in Resolution 95-39 are incorporated by reference herein.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED, in accordance with Resolution 95-39, that Title 13, California Code of Regulations, section 1956.9 is adopted, and sections 2030, 2031, and the incorporated documents, are amended, as set forth in Attachment 1 hereto.
