EXECUTIVE ORDER W-16-041B

Relating to CARB Approval of Third-Party Certifiers under
section 93120.4, title 17, California Code of Regulations

Intertek-York

WHEREAS, the California Air Resources Board (CARB) has adopted the "Airborne Toxic Control Measure (ATCM) to Reduce Formaldehyde Emissions from Composite Wood Products" (title 17, California Code of Regulations, sections 93120-93120.12), which establishes formaldehyde emission standards for composite wood products;

WHEREAS, section 93120.3(b) of the ATCM requires that manufacturers of composite wood products must verify compliance with the formaldehyde emission standards by using a third-party certifier approved by CARB;

WHEREAS, the ATCM requires third-party certifiers to: 1) verify the accuracy of the emission test procedures and facilities used by composite wood product manufacturers to conduct formaldehyde emission tests; 2) monitor manufacturer quality assurance programs; and 3) provide independent audits and inspections;

WHEREAS, section 93120.4 of the ATCM sets forth the process for the CARB Executive Officer to approve third-party certifiers;

WHEREAS, section 93120.4(b)(1) of the ATCM requires that applications to become CARB-approved third-party certifiers must be submitted to the Executive Officer in writing and must contain: 1) evidence of actual field experience in the verification of laboratories and wood products, to demonstrate how applicants will be able to competently perform the requirements for third-party certifiers of composite wood products listed in section 93120.12, Appendix 3, of the ATCM; 2) evidence of the ability to properly train and supervise inspectors; 3) evidence of a current "product certification agency" accreditation; and 4) a list of the composite wood products that the applicant is applying to verify and evidence that the applicant is qualified to verify these products;

WHEREAS, Architectural Testing, Inc., (ATI or the "applicant") submitted an application that was received on October 11, 2013, and deemed complete on December 11, 2013;

WHEREAS, the application indicated that ATI does not plan to conduct formaldehyde testing and has a contractual agreement with a subcontract

laboratory to provide accredited laboratory testing services; the application included documentation regarding the qualifications of the subcontract laboratory;

WHEREAS, section 93120.4(b)(4) of the ATCM provides that the Executive Officer shall approve the application and issue an Executive Order if the evidence submitted by the applicant is sufficient to demonstrate that the applicant can competently perform the tasks specified in section 93120.12, Appendix 3, of the ATCM;

WHEREAS, ATI was issued Executive Order W-13-041, signed on December 31, 2013;

WHEREAS, section 93120.4(b)(4) of the ATCM allows CARB-approved third-party certifiers to apply for re-approval by CARB by submitting an updated application;

WHEREAS, ATI submitted an updated application for re-approval to CARB on December 7, 2015, which indicated that they are now owned by Intertek, that they will no longer use their original subcontract laboratory, and instead will use Intertek-Shanghai (TPC-31) and Intertek-Shenzhen (TPC-33) as subcontract laboratories;

WHEREAS, ATI's request for re-approval was approved and ATI was issued Executive Order W-16-041, signed on May 13, 2016;

WHEREAS, ATI submitted a request to CARB on May 24, 2017, to change their name to Intertek-ATI, and to add Intertek-Hong Kong (TPC-32) as a subcontract laboratory;

WHEREAS, ATI's request was approved and Intertek-ATI was issued amended Executive Order W-16-041A, signed on June 22, 2017;

WHEREAS, Intertek-ATI submitted a request on October 25, 2017, to change their name to Intertek-York; and

WHEREAS, it is appropriate to approve this request, and it is appropriate that Executive Order W-16-041A be superseded by this Executive Order W-16-041B.

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED that Intertek-York is hereby approved as a third-party certifier and is issued the following number designating them as an CARB-approved third-party certifier: **TPC-41**.

BE IT FURTHER ORDERED that Intertek-York is a CARB-approved third-party certifier for the following composite wood products: hardwood plywood, particleboard, and medium density fiberboard.

BE IT FURTHER ORDERED that this approval is subject to the following conditions:

1. Intertek-York must provide their CARB-approved third-party certifier number to each manufacturer it has contracted with for services, as specified in section 93120.12, Appendix 3, of the ATCM.
2. Intertek-York's subcontract laboratories listed in Attachment A must participate in an inter-laboratory comparison of their primary and/or secondary chamber facilities.
3. If Intertek-York wishes to use a subcontractor other than those listed in Attachment A, Intertek-York must submit a request to the Executive Officer in writing and must provide evidence to demonstrate that the subcontractor can competently perform the tasks for which it is employed. Intertek-York shall not use any subcontractors unless the Executive Officer approves the request in writing.
4. Intertek-York shall immediately notify the Executive Officer if any accreditation or certification provided in support of their initial application is renewed, allowed to expire, or revoked within the duration of this Executive Order.

BE IT FURTHER ORDERED that this Executive Order W-16-041B supersedes Executive Order W-16-041A, which was issued on June 22, 2017.

BE IT FURTHER ORDERED that this Executive Order shall have a duration of two years from the original date it was executed, May 13, 2016; within 120 days prior to the expiration of the Executive Order, the third-party certifier may apply for re-approval by submitting an updated application to the Executive Officer as provided in section 93120.4 of the ATCM.

BE IT FURTHER ORDERED that the Executive Officer may review and, for good cause, modify or revoke this Executive Order as provided in section 93120.4(d) of the ATCM. The Executive Officer shall not modify or revoke this Executive Order without affording the third-party certifier the opportunity for a hearing in accordance with the procedures specified in title 17, California Code of Regulations, section 60055.1 et seq.

BE IT FURTHER ORDERED that the third-party certifier must maintain records in electronic or hard copy form for two years, for review by CARB upon request, as specified in section 93120.12, Appendix 3, of the ATCM.

BE IT FURTHER ORDERED that on or before March 1 of each year, the third-party certifier must provide an annual report to CARB for the previous calendar year, as specified in section 93120.12, Appendix 3, of the ATCM.

BE IT FURTHER ORDERED that the third-party certifier must notify the Executive Officer in writing within 30 days of any change in their ability to carry out the responsibilities of this Executive Order.
