Dear Manufacturer/Stakeholder:

The California Air Resources Board (CARB) has been working with manufacturers, cargo tank companies, and oil companies in an effort to investigate the potential use of rotatable elbows used on cargo tanks as part of the Enhanced Vapor Recovery certification program. At present, we have tested and certified rotatable adaptors used on service stations and have not tested any rotatable elbows at this time.

Our main concern with rotatable elbows is enforceability. Currently designed elbows can be used interchangeably on either rotating or non-rotating type adaptors. Therefore, there is no assurance that a facility with standard adaptors will receive deliveries only from cargo tanks equipped with rotating elbows. To ensure that only rotating elbows are used on facilities with non-rotating (standard) adaptors, we are seeking design suggestions for a specific adaptor/elbow configuration that could be used. Ideally, the rotating elbows could continue to be used on currently certified products (i.e., "swivel" adaptors and standard adaptors). We would like to avoid a configuration in which a standard elbow (non-rotating) is used with a non-rotating adaptor. Ultimately, we would like to standardize the accepted solution.

Your written comments or suggestions relating to a specially designed adaptor or elbow would be greatly appreciated by no later than September 1, 2001. At that time, we will consider each of the various suggestions. We will also provide an opportunity for each stakeholder to comment on the accepted CARB solution prior to adopting new standards.
