EXECUTIVE ORDER G-70-214

Modification of the Operative and Effective Dates for Phase II Vapor Recovery Systems, Including In-Station Diagnostics (ISD), for Use with Gasoline Dispensing Facilities (GDF) that Include Liquid Condensate Traps (LCT)

WHEREAS, the California Air Resources Board (ARB) has established, pursuant to California Health and Safety Code sections 25290.1.2, 39600, 39601 and 41954, certification procedures for systems designed for the control of gasoline vapor emissions during motor vehicle fueling operations (Phase II EVR vapor recovery systems) in its CP-201, **Certification Procedure for Vapor Recovery Systems at Gasoline Dispensing Facilities** (Certification Procedure) as last amended May 25, 2006, incorporated by reference in title 17, California Code of Regulations, section 94011;

WHEREAS, ARB has determined, after consulting with industry and Air Districts, that there are a number of GDFs throughout California that include *Liquid Condensate Traps*, as the term is defined in D-200 **Definitions for Vapor Recovery Procedures** as last amended on May 25, 2006, incorporated by reference in title 17, California Code of Regulations, section 94010;

WHEREAS, section 2.4.4 of the Certification Procedure allows the Executive Officer to change the operative and effective dates of new performance standards and specifications when certified systems meeting the applicable standards and specifications are not certified by the operative dates specified in Table 2-1 of the Certification Procedure;

WHEREAS, ARB issued Executive Order G-70-211 on June 13, 2008, allowing the use of certified Onboard Refueling Vapor Recovery (ORVR) compatible systems on GDFs that include LCTs until April 1, 2010.


WHEREAS, the first LCT was first certified on December 10, 2009, with the issuance of Executive Order VR-201-L for the Healy Phase II EVR system; and

WHEREAS, industry and air districts informed ARB that GDFs with LCTs cannot obtain all applicable permits by the April 1, 2010, deadline.

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that Phase II vapor recovery systems that have been certified to be ORVR compatible may continue to be used on gasoline dispensing facilities that include LCTs until April 1, 2012.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that GDFs that include LCTs and that dispense greater than 600,000 gallons per year may continue to operate without ISD until April 1, 2012.
